Parent's Guide Nursery pre-writing activity: In and Out!

<u>Objective:</u>

• Your child will be able to practice pre-writing skills with lacing and drawing.

Materials required:

- 1. Pipe cleaner
- 2.2 to 3 shoelaces
- 3. Printed out words (provided on the website)
- 4. Printed out animal characters and house (provided on the website)
- 5.Hole puncher
- 6. Coloured markers
- 7. (Optional) Laminator

<u>Material set-up:</u>

[Level 1 set-up]

- 1. Print the word cards (cow, sheep, pig, chick)
- 2. Laminate the word cards (optional)

[Level 2 set-up]

- 1. Print the animal illustrations (cow, sheep, pig, chick)
- 2. Cut the shape of the animals out, ensure that there is a thick border outlining the animals
- 3. Laminate the illustrations/paste illustrations on a cardboard
- 4. Punch holes around the outline of the animals

[Level 3 set-up]

- 1. Print the house template
- 2. Cut the shape of the house out, ensure that there is a thick border outlining the house
- 3. Laminate the house/paste it on a cardboard
- 4. Punch holes around the outline of the house

How is the activity carried out?

There are 3 levels to this activity, catering to different levels of learning abilities.

[Level 1]

- 1. Allow your child to bend the pipe cleaners according to the shape of the letters
- 2. Start with the word "cow", followed by "pig", then "chick", and lastly "sheep".

Guiding question(s)

- What letter is this?
- What other animals have the same letter in their names?





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[Level 2]

- 1. Using the animal characters with holes punched around it, allow your child to to lace around the animals with a shoelace.
- 2. Start with the chick, followed by the cow, then the pig, and lastly the sheep.

Guiding question(s)

• Was that an "in" or "out" action?

[Level 3]

- 1. Task your child to draw an animal of their choice inside the house
- 2. Task your child to lace along the outline of the house using a shoelace to "build a house" for the animal that they have drawn.

Guiding question(s)

• What animal did you draw? Can you spell it's name?

How the activity enhance your child's literacy. development?

- Pre-writing skills are essential for the child to be able to develop the ability to hold and move a pencil fluently and effectively and therefore produce legible writing (Kid Sense, n.d.).
- 2. Lacing activities help children develop fine motor skills, hand-eye coordination, motor planning and visual perceptual skills.

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
